

P4G Copenhagen Summit 19-20 October

Partnering for Green Growth and the Global Goals 2030 (P4G) is a global initiative with the ambition of becoming the world's leading forum for developing concrete public-private partnerships at scale to deliver on the Sustainable Development Goals and the Paris Climate Agreement.

n 19-20 October 2018, Denmark will gather heads of states and governments, together with leaders of international organisations, businesses, academic institutions and civil society at the P4G Copenhagen Summit to form a **powerful global coalition for sustainable growth through innovative partnerships.**

Delivering on the SDGs demands active engagement of the private sector, where policies need to be combined with existing solutions, new innovation and enabling finance. We know that partnerships are the way forward. **P4G provides the missing link** by offering a platform where commitments and ideas can be realised by connecting the do'ers in public-private partnerships. The P4G Copenhagen Summit will be a place for developing, accelerating, and showcasing partnerships of large-scale impact.

Whether it is partnering through new financing models to address the shortage of water, creating new models for mobility in megacities, implementing new production techniques to address the food crisis, scaling energy optimisation of buildings, or developing innovative solutions for addressing plastic waste, the facilitation of partnerships will be a key part of the Summit.

The Summit will pay special attention to **cities** as increasingly important centers of economic activity. In the immediate future, increased urbanisation is expected to trigger an enormous demand for new sustainable solutions.

On the first day of the Summit, particpants will be **matched in working sessions** with relevant potential partners from other countries, businesses, finance institutions, and international organisations committed to sustainable development, in order to develop new partnerships or take existing partnerships to a new level. Global state-of-the-art partnerships will be showcased and awarded at the Summit.

The second day will commence at the Danish Radio Concert Hall. In prominent surroundings with participation of the Danish Royal Court, heads of state and governments, CEOs, leaders of civil society and organisations will review the outcomes from the first day of the Summit, elevate cross-cutting themes, and recognise state-of-the-art partnerships at the **P4G Awards Ceremony.**
