Participating countries endorsed a declaration calling for people-centered green growth policies and support for global entrepreneurship and innovation.

At our pre-Summit, representatives from our nine partner countries gathered for deep crosscountry dialogue, strategic planning for our growth and expert-led sessions on financing climate innovation during our annual NP Gathering. We also hosted our Global Advisory Council meeting, where high-level leaders endorsed our new growth strategy, including plans to diversify funding for greater impact.
